



Handling In The Field

Q • At the beginning of my field sequence the judges told me to handle my dog like I normally would, but then during the test sometimes they asked me to call my dog around (when I normally wouldn't) and other times asked me not to call him (when I normally would). What gives?

Why was I asked not to give my dog a "whoa" command when he was clearly "getting birdy?" I didn't want him to go in and catch the bird.

Several other handlers told me that I would be penalized for calling my dog during the NA test. Is that true?

A • Knowing when you should give your dog commands in the field during testing can be confusing. Typically, whether it's an NA, UPT, or UT test, before going out in the field the judge handling you and your dog will often tell you something like this: "Handle your dog as you normally would during training or hunting..." And this is exactly what you should do. Often, though, at some point one of the judges may ask you to call your dog around when you might not have otherwise.

Why might the judges ask you to call your dog around? There are many reasons why, but, in my experience, one of the most common reasons is to get your dog out of potential trouble. For example, late in the day, the previously flushed but unshot birds often congregate in woods adjacent to the field where you're testing; if judges see your dog going into an area they know is full of birds running in the open, they may tell you to call your dog out of there because, really, nothing good can happen in that situation. Remember, the judges are truly there to help you. Another reason judges may ask you to call your dog is to get it back into the relevant area. As described in the Search portion of the *NAVHDA: Aims, Program, Test Rules* booklet, "the dog should conduct its search at a practical distance from the gun" and "... the uncontrolled dog running the far horizons is of little use to the on-foot hunter." If the judges sense that your dog

may be out of practical range, they will likely ask you to call him back. Yet another reason they may ask you to call your dog is to get a sense of whether your dog is cooperative or, in the case of the UPT or UT test, obedient (obedience is not scored in the NA test). Handlers and their dogs should display a sense of teamwork, particularly in the UPT and UT tests; a dog that won't heed a handler's call to come around will probably not be getting maximum scores in cooperation or obedience. Still another reason a judge may ask you to call your dog around when you might not normally is to get it on a bird in a known location. Perhaps they are on the fence about your pointing score, or steadiness or retrieving in UPT and UT, and need to see another bird contact to settle the issue.

Equally often, judges might ask you to *not* give your dog verbal commands when you might normally. Again, there are way too

many reasons why this might be the case to describe here, but always when this happens, they are trying to help you and your dog in some way. Perhaps they want to see a little more independence and willingness to search. Maybe you were either knowingly or unknowingly "whoa-ing" your dog when you see it getting birdy. If this happens, judges will almost certainly ask you not to do that on subsequent bird contacts, because a dog on "whoa" is not pointing. Again, quoting from the Aims manual, "When game is located the dog must establish point naturally. The handler is strictly prohibited from giving any commands or gestures which may induce the dog to point." With respect to the "whoa" command, many of us use it during training after the dog has gone on point as we are moving in to flush the bird, and then instinctively use it at that time during testing. Here is another case where judges may ask you to keep quiet so that they can fully judge steadiness. The whoa


command in this circumstance should definitely be used if you absolutely need it to stop the dog from breaking, but otherwise try and resist the temptation. Another reason you might be asked to keep quiet is to assess cooperation or obedience – does the dog pay attention to where you are and move with you, or is it out self-hunting? A dog that doesn't care where his or her handler is and is out hunting for itself alone is not a cooperative dog, and his or her scores will probably reflect that.

I can't tell you the number of times I've seen or heard judges ask a handler to call their dog around and the handler stays quiet. Sometimes it's nerves – handlers often don't hear too well when they're running dogs (I know I don't!). A number of handlers, though, have told me and others that they've heard that verbally communicating with their dog during the field search is penalized in some way. This is absolutely untrue! You should remember that you and your dog are a team, and teamwork requires communication. Trust me, if judges feel you're being too communicative, they'll tell you.

During testing, remember to "handle your dog as you normally do during training or hunting." If the judges need to see something or you are overdoing it, they will let you know. Remember, NAVHDA Judges are trying to help you get the best performance from your dog. 🐾

Memorial Youth Hunt

On Saturday, September 9, 2017, the Finger Lakes Chapter in Upstate New York hosted our First Annual Joe Wolak Memorial Youth Hunt. Joe was a mentor and friend to many handlers over the years, and his beloved German Short-haired Pointers tested at all levels of NAVHDA and AKC. Joe's wife, Arlene; son, Jeff; and great granddaughter, Rachel, were guests of honor at the event.

As this was our first event, the number of participants was limited to fifteen. We had heard that getting a full roster would be a challenge, however, we had twenty applicants. Those that didn't get in were referred to an upcoming Pheasants Forever youth hunt. Many of our chapter members are also members of a local Pheasants Forever chapter and have experience with their events as well. This proved beneficial for our first NAVHDA youth-focused event.

We stressed that you need not have a dog to join and come out and learn about the breeds and dog handling.

The agenda for the day included an introduction to NAVHDA, safety overview, clay bird shoot, field hunt for pheasants and

chukar, and discussions of the three levels of NAVHDA testing. We provided demonstrations of drags, a utility duck search, a water retrieve, and handling techniques. We stressed that NAVHDA dogs are tested to a standard rather than competing with other dogs. This allows a large cheering gallery for every dog, along with judges who provide guidance to handlers so they may be successful in their testing. This is clearly unique in the spectrum of dog testing. Overall, the focus was on safety and an abundance of fun! This article is short as the smiles in the photos tell the story best.

NAVHDA international had suggested that we have a designated Safety Officer accompany each dog and handler team. That turned out to be great advice both for safety purposes and as a way to explain events as they occurred in the field to both the youth and the accompanying mentor/parent. Some of the youths shot so well that our group of designated test gunners might be replaced in the near future!

At the conclusion of the hunt, I deep fried some pheasant tenders and the participating youth shared them with all present.



Pheasant Tender Recipe:

- Skin pheasant
- Fillet each breast from bone
- Cut each breast into three or four tenders (makes 6 to 8 tenders per pheasant)
- Soak in saltwater brine for a few minutes and rinse
- Soak in milk and egg solution
- Shake in a batter of:
 - 9 oz bag of Louisiana Seasoned Chicken Fry batter mix
 - 8.5 oz box of Jiffy Corn Muffin Mix (this adds a touch of sweetness)
 - A few sprinkles of Spicy Hot Famous Dave's Chikn' Wing Seasoning

I deep fry just until they start to turn gold - 4 to 5 minutes. They cook fast, hardly any time for beverages! Enjoy with wing sauce & blue cheese or honey mustard sauce.

Suggestion: Prepare half without Dave's first and then half with. Just as many people prefer them without seasoning.

Note: Left-overs make a great salad topping. The balance of the skinned pheasant gets par-boiled, meat removed from bones and frozen. This is the stock for pheasant-rice soup for upcoming deer camps and snow storms.


They were a big hit and I was asked to share the recipe - included on this page.

GUN SAFETY

After a waterfowl hunt last fall, friends told me about needing to remind a youth who was hunting with them to watch his muzzle direction, pay attention to his assigned shooting zone, and not shoot near or over another hunter's head. The youth had passed his hunter safety course. Had been hunting for two years. He knew the safety rules, but in the excitement of watching decoying ducks he stopped paying attention to his gun and could only think about taking a shot.

To help the youth develop more permanent safe gun handling skills, whether he was duck hunting or upland hunting, the hunters came up with a plan for next year. First, instead of all five hunters in the pit or spread across the pheasant field being allowed to shoot—which translates into five active shooting zones, only three hunters would be designated shooters for each opportunity. Besides reducing the number of shooters at any time, it would give them wid-

er shooting lanes—a clear center lane and two end sweeps.

Second, each day of the hunt one hunter would be the “gun warden.” That person would hunt but would also be responsible for watching everyone's gun handling and telling them if something looked unsafe. The gun warden position would rotate among the adult hunters. Resenting criticism would be lessened since it would be the warden's “job” and because everyone would get a chance.

Third, there would be a “time out” ruling if someone – youth or adult – commits a safety violation. Time out would mean that hunter would skip his or her next shooting turn and have to wait for the rotation to come around again.

By including all the hunters in this three part program (as opposed to just reminding and reprimanding the youth), both young and old, novice and experienced shooters all contribute to a safer, more enjoyable hunt.

Smart plan.

Ranger was the third English Setter in NAVHDA history to earn the Versatile Champion title. Additionally, Ranger earned his Master Hunter title in the AKC Hunt Test system.

Ranger was hunted on wild birds throughout the Northeast U.S. and several provinces in Canada. He had a love for waterfowl hunting, and delighted in retrieving ducks and geese.

During his lifetime, Ranger was bred to two different females, producing several litters. His progeny have earned twelve qualifying NA scores (five Prize I), one qualifying UPT score, nineteen qualifying UT scores (nine Prize I), and three Versatile Champions. Additionally, Ranger sired two NAVHDA Breeders Award Litters as well as several other litters that qualify for NAVHDA Breeders Awards.

Today, there are many English Setters running in the NAVHDA testing system that trace their roots back to Ranger, as many of his outstanding progeny have also started to produce excellent NAVHDA dogs.

Drake's Big Day



My six-year-old son Drake has helped me with dog training for the last few years. He always asks me how much fun I've had testing over the weekend. Drake has been to tests with me and has just sat in the parking lot watching the field to see how our dogs do. Every time I come back he says, "Wow Dad, that looked good!"—seemingly wondering what it's like out there with all the people and a couple dogs.

This past spring I entered Drake and his newest puppy Jamo in Northern Illinois Natural Ability Test set for September 23. Drake was beyond himself—excited to finally get out in the field and see what it's like with real judges.

As time went by, I bet he told every other person he came across that he was running dogs in the fall! He prepared for this test for weeks leading up to it...on how to release the dog on a track, how to flush a bird, how to throw the bumper in the water, etc. The night before the test, Drake asked me questions like, "Dad, are the judges friendly?" and, "Dad, what if I make a mistake?" I assured him that, no matter the outcome, it would be fun.



As the morning of the test came, Drake was filled with anxiety and scared to meet the judges. Upon being called to the field, a Judge by the name of Bob Fee came to Drake, got down on one knee, and said to him, “Boy, are we going to have fun today!” Bob asked my son if he has ever done this before, and Drake said, “Only in practice.” I could see confidence in Drake’s eyes immediately, and, before I knew it, Bob was showing Drake how to hold the dog’s collar before releasing. I followed along as Drake and Bob talked about everything from the moon and stars, to how many dogs they each have. I can’t say enough about how thankful I am that Bob was there that day to take my son on his first hunt test run. Drake talked about hunting with Mr. Fee almost the whole way home. I’m sure Drake Mann will never forget that day in the field that he finally got to meet the judges. Bob took the nerves that Drake had for meeting a judge and turned it into enough confidence that Drake was the best handler there that day!

Ask Dr. Boyer

A popular old wives’ tale says that one dog-year is equal to seven human-years. Although not exactly accurate on a physiological level, we know that dogs age more rapidly than their owners do. Their aging process means that senior-citizen status is conferred as early as six years in some breeds, and that special attention needs to be paid to nutrition, medical care and exercise to keep your pet happy and hunting for many years.

Routine Health Screenings

Surprisingly, only 14% of senior pets undergo regular veterinarian recommended health screenings.¹ Several reasons exist for annual or semiannual well-pet veterinary checkups. This might seem too frequent, but remember that if your dog sees a veterinarian once a year, that is similar to your going to the doctor once every seven years. In most cases, semiannual visits are ideal.

It is important that your pet has “baseline” lab tests for future comparison and to detect minor changes that might already be

present. Dogs that appear healthy can have abnormalities in their urine and blood that, if left undetected, can lead to serious disease. Early detection allows for intervention before your pet exhibits symptoms and while conditions can be improved. Your veterinarian should conduct a thorough physical exam that includes evaluations of the heart, skin, lymph nodes, teeth and oral cavity, central nervous system, abdominal organs, muscles and bones. In addition, your veterinarian should examine for a common cancer (anal gland adenocarcinoma). A thorough history and physical exam, in combination with routine wellness testing, will help you and your veterinarian formulate a plan to keep your hunting partner in peak physical condition.

Dental Care

Caring for your dog’s mouth is an important part of keeping your hunting dog healthy. Most senior pets have some dental disease. A pet that has inflamed gums, fractured teeth or severe tartar buildup not only has bad breath, but also might be in pain. This can lead to a decrease in appetite, a resistance to retrieving game or a general change in energy level. Research supports the fact that dental disease contributes to early heart or kidney disease. If your pet is otherwise healthy, the risk of the dental disease exceeds the risk of anesthesia, even for senior dogs. Your veterinarian will use safe anesthetic protocols to minimize pet risk. After I have cleaned a dog’s teeth, I frequently get reports that he is more energetic and playful, often acting like a puppy.



Nutrition

As dogs age, their nutritional needs change. Some dog foods are labeled for “senior dogs” and in some cases can be appropriate for your pet. Senior dog foods usually have fewer calories and a different protein content than in regular maintenance diets. Depending on your dog’s physical status and activity level, your veterinarian might recommend them. Discuss this issue with your veterinarian as part of your pet’s annual health examination.

As your dog gets older, it becomes important to consider adding supplements such as omega-3 fatty acids (fish oil), glucosamine and chondroitin sulfate, and antioxidants. These supplements might help osteoarthritis and possibly prevent some cancers.

Exercise

Be aware of your aging dog’s exercise needs and abilities. Exercise is important for your pet for many reasons, including cardiovascular health, mental stimulation and bone/joint health. Becoming aware of your dog’s limitations, however, is also essential. Allow adequate time for warm-up and cool-down. Your dog might not be able to hunt as long or hard as before but he can continue to work within reasonable parameters. Pay particular attention to his feet; ensure that nails are trimmed. Long nails change the way the paw hits the ground and predisposes a dog to injury.

Warning Signs

You know your dog better than anyone else does and you play a key role in maintaining his health. The best prevention is early detection of disease. See your veterinarian if you notice any of the following signs in your senior dog:

- Increased thirst or urination
- Weight loss or gain without a change in diet/activity
- Skin tumors/masses or wounds that do not heal
- Slowing down – unable/resistant to running, jumping or climbing stairs
- Decreased appetite
- Loss of vision/hearing

Knowing When to Say Goodbye/End-of-Life Care

A common question from pet owners is, “How will I know when it is time to consider euthanasia?” I generally tell people that they are the best judge of their dog’s quality of life. I have adopted sev-

eral benchmarks over the years to help pet owners make decisions for their pets when their quality of life is questionable.

Pets need to be able to urinate and defecate and be able to move themselves away from the area where they voided (i.e., not remain lying in their own waste). In addition, they should be able to eat, drink and interact in some meaningful way with their family. The final, and perhaps the most important consideration, is that they not be in pain. It is wise to discuss quality-of-life issues with your veterinarian and you should think ahead to know your options. Some owners will go to any extreme to save an ailing pet, sometimes to the pet’s detriment. Discussions with family members before a crisis will help if you are in a situation that requires end-of-life care.

Much progress has been made over the years about pain management and palliative care for an aging and ailing pet. Acupuncture and Chinese herbs, as well as the use of cold-laser or stem-cell therapy, have improved quality of life for pets that have arthritis, cancer or other diseases.

For owners who want to follow more traditional medical practices, many advances in the use of pain medication allow your pet to remain more active and comfortable. Signs of pain in your dog can be subtle. Some dogs might have only a decreased appetite or might sleep more. Other dogs might vocalize or act anxious. Pets might not interact as frequently with family members or they might show elevations in heart rate, temperature or blood pressure. If you suspect that your dog is in pain, discuss treatment options with your veterinarian. Never give your dog any over-the-counter human medication such as Tylenol, Motrin or Aleve. They are toxic to dogs and can lead to kidney and liver failure. Many economical pain medications are available to keep your pet comfortable as he ages.

As your dog ages, remember that she might need a little TLC. However, old age is not a disease. I treat many dogs who hunt well into their senior years. Their wisdom and experience make them excellent hunting partners. Attention to nutrition, exercise, wellness health examinations and pain management can add extra years of life to your best friend! 🐾

Apple Beer Battered Dove Breasts

With Apple Butter BBQ Dipping Sauce



I read recently, "Enough hunt tests! Enough field trials! Enough sporting clays! It's time to shoot something edible!" Being the first of the hunting season, doves catch us anxious to hunt—a perfect time to sit on a 5-gallon bucket and work some retriever training on those scrappy little flight wizards. Perhaps cruise the marsh or fields edges in search of that future duck blind or pheasant hunt, while bringing home some free-range, organic, grass fed, hormone free dinner.

In many states, there are several species of doves that are legal to hunt in season: mourning dove, ringed turtle dove, and white winged dove to name three. There is also the Eurasian collared dove that is considered an invasive species as well as rock doves, better known as pigeons, that may have no season or bag limit in some states. Check your states game laws and be familiar with the different species in the area you hunt.

Jackson Landers writes in *Eating Aliens: One Man's Adventures Hunting Invasive Animal Species*, "In my experience, one species of dove or pigeon tastes pretty much like every other species...expect a rich, tightly grained red meat that has more in common with goose or beef than chicken."

Since dove season and apple picking season often coincide, enjoy this recipe for Apple Beer Battered Dove Breasts with Apple Butter BBQ Dipping Sauce.

Ingredients

- 1 ½ lbs. of dove breasts
- ½ cup seasoned flour (salt, pepper, paprika or your favorite spice blend)
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 bottle apple flavored beer, like Angry Orchard or Red's Apple Ale

Instructions

- Dry and dust the dove breasts with seasoned flour.
- Combine the all purpose flour and baking powder in a bowl. Whisk in the beaten eggs and about half the bottle of beer. Judge how thick you like your batter and just enjoy the rest of the beer.
- Heat oil deep enough to cover your battered breasts, 375°, in a pot or fryer.
- Using a fork, dredge each breast in the batter and drop into the hot oil, a few at a time, careful not to overload the pot or fryer. Fry until golden. Remove and blot on a paper towel.

Dipping Sauce

Stir together equal parts Mayonnaise, BBQ Sauce and Apple Butter. 

PROTECTING BIRD DOGS AGAINST TICKS

Understanding tick-borne diseases is a continuum, as the distribution of tick species, their regional prevalence and the infectious pathogens they carry fluctuate seasonally based on weather, rainfall and climate. Although the 2017 tick season is winding down, bird dog owners should be vigilant as the tick crop was heavy due to two consecutive mild winters and an exceptionally wet spring. The possibility of a tick bite causing severe or life-threatening illness warrants being tick-savvy.

Jason Stull, VMD, PhD, DACVPM, assistant professor of preventive medicine at The Ohio State University and presenter at the AKC Canine Health Foundation National Parent Club Canine Health Conference, held this past August in St. Louis, says, "The challenge with tick-borne diseases is forecasting their regional prevalence and how common they may be."

Although there is no way of knowing the number of dogs infected annually by tick bites, tick-borne diseases certainly have become a growing threat. Bird dogs could be at high-exposure risk due to the spreading geographical distribution of ticks. Highly prevalent, tick-borne diseases currently are found in all 50 states.

"What's more, tick-borne diseases are transmitted by zoonotic pathogens, meaning they can infect people, too," Dr. Stull advises. "It's crucial to protect two- and four-legged individuals alike during hunting trips or field trials."

The best antidote to protect dogs against tick-borne diseases is to use tick preventives, practice head-to-tail body checks after being outdoors, and screen annually for infection.

USE TICK PREVENTIVES YEAR-ROUND

Tick preventives reduce the transmission of tick-borne diseases by repelling ticks that eventually die or killing ticks already attached to a dog. The type of product and how it's used varies by a dog's exposure risk, safety, and frequency of swimming or bathing. Talk to your veterinarian to determine which product is best for your dog.

Tick prevention should be maintained year-round, especially while traveling. "Just because spring and summer are at the peak of tick season doesn't mean there's zero risk for ticks the rest of the year," Dr. Stull cautions.

TAKE TIME FOR HEAD-TO-TAIL BODY CHECKS

Because tick-borne diseases can be transmitted in as little as three to six hours of a tick bite, it's important to perform a head-to-tail body check on your dog immediately after spending time outdoors.

If you find a tick, remove it by grasping it as close to the skin as possible with tweezers, pulling up firmly. Avoid squeezing or twisting to prevent the transfer of the tick's bodily fluids. Kill the tick immediately by placing it in a container with rubbing alcohol and apply a mild antiseptic to your dog's wound.



GET TESTED FOR AN INFECTION

You should consider having your dog screened annually for an infection. Blood testing detects the presence of an antibody, one product of the dog's immune response against a pathogen, while polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing detects the DNA of the organism itself. Both are fast and effective, and could save you money down the road if a tick-borne

disease isn't caught in its early stages.

Luckily, advances are helping to keep dogs safe from tick-borne diseases. The AKC Canine Health Foundation continues its mission to learn more about the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of dogs affected by tick-borne diseases by starting its second year of the Tick-Borne Disease Initiative. With the renewal of its fundraising for the cause, the AKC will again match gifts up to \$250,000. In fact, two new grants to support research on tick-borne diseases — including a study to develop best practices for preventing and controlling Lyme disease that's being led by Dr. Stull — just received funding as part of this initiative.

Tick season doesn't have to be scary. Be tick-smart and take preventive measures to help keep you and your bird dog out of harm's way. ■




